

In accordance with Rule 9 of the Competition Commission Rules of Procedure 2009, the Executive Director of the Competition Commission is required to draw an administrative timetable making provision for the major stages of an investigation.

The following timetable has been set for the investigation into the potential exploitative conduct by Cellplus Mobile Communications Ltd with respect to the pricing and configuration of its pay-as-you-go mobile data services.

The investigation has been referenced as "INV057 - Pay-as-you-go mobile data services of Cellplus Mobile Communications Ltd".

Upon receipt of the Final Report of the said investigation, the Commission may, in accordance with sections 55 and 56 of the Competition Act 2007, convene a hearing to listen to the views of any person it considers having a relevant interest in the case. As per Rule 29(2) of the Competition Commission Rules
